Program Grant Guidelines	Capital Improvement Grant Guidelines
These guidelines are for programs only. Eligible* projects are those that would occur anywhere between 77th St., near Wabasso, and the North Indian River County line, east of I-95. <i>*Youth sports programs will not be considered, as these are being funded by the ShrimpFest.</i> Company/Organization must submit a letter on its letterhead to Sebastian Clambake Foundation that includes the following: 1. Name of the company/organization and its mission. 2. Details of the program for which funding is being requested. 3. Explanation of how this program will serve our local community. 4. Amount of funding requested. Supporting documentation may include the following: 1. A list of the members of the company/organization's Board of Directors. 2. The total budget for the program. 3. Documentation regarding any companies/organizations that are in partnership with the program. 4. Other sources of funding already obtained. 5. One or two letters of support from community leaders or others involved in the program. 6. Copy of 501 documentation.	These guidelines are for capital improvements only. Eligible projects are those that would occur anywhere between 77th St., near Wabasso, and the North Indian River County line, east of I-95 Additionally, projects located within two miles of this area may be considered when two conditions are met: 1) the sponsoring company/organization is wholly based within the area, and 2) unique restraint associated with the project requires that it be physically located outside the area. Company/Organization must submit a letter on its letterhead to Sebastian Clambake Foundation that includes the following: 1. Name of the company/organization and its mission. 2. Details of the project for which funding is being requested. 3. Explanation of how this project will serve our local community. 4. Amount of funding requested. Supporting documentation may include the following: 1. A list of the members of the organization's Board of Directors. 2. The total budget for the project. 3. Documentation regarding any organizations that are in partnership with the project. 4. Other sources of funding already obtained. 5. One or two letters of support from community leaders or others involved in the project. 6. Copy of 501 documentation.
